## Highlight

The REFINEE project continues to make strong progress in its mission to unlock private investment for energy efficiency projects, with a focus on financing mechanisms for energy efficiency and encouraging inclusion in energy communities.

Project partners are ending soon the creation of governance structure of the schemes in both countries. Based on macroeconomic analysis, the offer of other instruments on the markets and specific financing needs that have been determined based on preliminary market analyses, the governance structure will be described in details in two separate documents one in Italian and the other one in Croatian.

In parallel the focus of activities will be on partnership with the main stakeholders, industrial clusters in Italy and SME's in Istria region, aiming to analyses their need and constraints and prepare projects which will form a scheme that will meet their needs and expectations. Sessions of 20 interviews with the key stakeholder will be organized in the forthcoming period.

The consortium is very close to the third in person meeting that will be held in November in Ljubljana and it will be hosted by our partner CER.

### IRENA: Presentation of project partner in charge for communication

IRENA is a regional energy agency established in 2008. to promote and coordinate sustainable energy development in the Istrian region. Besides financing solutions, the project will encourage the idea of joining small and mediumsized enterprises into energy communities.

# The Support of the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia for the Economic Transition of Enterprises

With the kick-off meeting of the REFINEE project, held in Udine on October 23, 2024, this project funded by the Life Program was launched. Its implementation in Italy involves the first operation of a basket bond dedicated to the enterprises in the territory of the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia.

The financing scheme will consist of a financial instrument in the form of a guarantee aimed at encouraging investments in the energy efficiency of local enterprises. The energy transition of enterprises in Friuli Venezia Giulia is inevitably intertwined with the strategic guidelines promoted by the regional administration.

The main planning and guidance tool in this regard is represented by the Regional Energy Plan (hereinafter also abbreviated as "PER"): it serves as the strategic reference tool through which the Region, in line with the guidelines of the national government and the European Union, identifies the main objectives and development directions for enhancing the regional energy system for the production, transport, and distribution of energy. A first step towards structuring the PER was taken with the analysis of the current situation, which presents the state of the territory concerning energy consumption and production in the region. In this context, particular attention is given to energy intensity, which is the ratio between energy consumption and the regional Gross Domestic Product, an indicator estimating the efficiency of the regional energy system. This ratio is also a function of variables not related to energy efficiency, as changes in the denominator are affected, for example, by structural changes in the economy and the lifestyle of the population.

The data derived from the analysis of the regional energy system and the projections made, evaluating potential evolutionary scenarios, have allowed for the definition of the following macro-objectives and related general objectives of the PER:

- Energy security;
- Energy independence.

The analyses conducted on the potential of the regional territory in terms of FER development and energy efficiency opportunities have led to the definition of 42 actions across various sectors of interest for regional energy planning, which effectively make up the operational approach of the Plan.

Once the approach of the Regional Administration of Friuli Venezia Giulia regarding the energy transition is understood, it is useful to comprehend how this approach supports local

enterprises that are following the path of energy transition. In particular, the main actions are found in the Plan Objective 8, titled "Reduce the consumption of enterprises." Below are the actions, with the implementing body being the Central Directorate for "Production Activities and Tourism":

- Action 08.1, titled "Grant contributions for the preparation of energy audits", provides
  for the granting of non-repayable grants, through PR FESR funds, to Small and Medium
  Enterprises active in the manufacturing sector with the aim of encouraging the use of
  energy audits;
- Action 08.2, titled "Grant contributions for the energy efficiency of enterprises", provides
  for the granting of non-repayable grants, through PR FESR funds, to manufacturing
  SMEs to encourage the reduction of energy consumption, the reduction of energy
  waste, and the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. This contribution system aims
  to act on the production process and the climate control of the plants but does not
  include interventions on the building envelope;
- Action 08.3, titled "Grant contributions for the establishment of plants powered by FER". provides for the granting of non-repayable grants for the establishment of FER.

From the three mentioned actions, it is possible to deduce, first of all, how they are complementary to the objectives of the REFINEE project, which looks at more significant investments aimed at implementing multiple interventions on the same production facilities and, therefore, at larger invested amounts. Furthermore, the financing scheme promoted by the REFINEE project will effectively be a financial instrument, according to Regulation (EU) No. 1060/2021, which will not provide for non-repayable contributions for the realization of investments. Additionally, considering the project framework of REFINEE, it is useful to highlight how the PER emphasizes the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia's intention to delve into the topic of "Renewable Energy Communities" (hereinafter also abbreviated as "CER"). The Regional Administration has indeed planned the organization of technical tables with stakeholders capable of providing useful data for defining new Plan objectives. In particular, the "Technical Table for CER" has been opened, culminating in a public event.

In conclusion, the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia is demonstrating a strong commitment to the energy transition of local SMEs, also through the REFINEE project. This project not only marks the beginning of an innovative basket bond operation but also represents a clear signal of the Region's willingness to encourage significant investments in energy efficiency. With the adoption of targeted financial instruments and non-repayable grants, the Region is actively supporting SMEs in their journey towards a more sustainable future.
