





















This publication proudly presents 20 representative projects from the territory of the Region of Istria, including the participation of all administrative departments and agencies of the Region of Istria – from the Istrian Development Agency (IDA) through the Istrian Regional Energy Agency (IRENA) to the Agency for Rural Development of Istria (AZRRI) as well as all other institutions founded by the Region of Istria.

Although it is an ungrateful task to single out just some of the projects, we would like to give a brief presentation of different projects from various activity areas of the Region of Istria in this publication.

During the pre-accession period, the Region of Istria proved the most successful in withdrawing funds from various European funds as well as other international programmes. A branched network of cooperation with foreign partners, memberships in international organizations, activities of the Office in Brussels contributed to enriching its experience and the participation of the Istria Region entities in 320 projects funded by the European and other international funds. The value of these projects for the Region of Istria, some of which are still being implemented, is 106 million euro.

As a full member of the European family, we are privy to structural funds which the bodies of the Region of Istria in cooperation with municipalities and cities, enterprises and civil society associations are planning to utilize by busily preparing projects worth 190 million euro for the period 2014-2020.

These very structural funds are our big development opportunity facilitating the delivery of those projects, which truth be told, we could not finance ourselves. We have therefore intensively been preparing for large infrastructural projects, primarily by developing technical documentation as a development basis. We have also been investing in employee education by trying to finance it through European projects.

Our priority projects come from the field of economy and agriculture, welfare, health and education, although tourism must not be neglected in view of the existing possibilities provided by European funds, which utilization must be improved in the following period.

Infrastructural projects have primarily been developed in cooperation with our municipalities and cities as owners of public property, entities best acquainted



with the existing needs on the territory in order to make our projects the engines and drivers of our region's balanced development.

We are expanding our friendly relationship to new partner regions such as Polish Malopolska or German Baden-Württemberg as well as new cooperation models recommended by the European Union including the European Grouping for Territorial Cooperation, which we plan to use as a basis for developing new projects and further earning of concrete financial benefit for our region.

We wish to continue our cross-border cooperation as a proof of borders not being barriers but connecting bridges thus contributing fully to the creation of the common European area.

INTRODUCTION

This publication has been funded by the European AdriGov project (Adriatic Governance Operational Plan), which was carried out as part of the 2007-2013 IPA Adriatic Cross-Border Cooperation Programme. The project was designed by friendly and partner regions on the basis of a long-lasting cooperation along the Adriatic-Ionian territory and partnerships created under the Adriatic Euroregion founded in 2006 in the city of Pula. The first joint project was Adri.Eur.O.P. which set up preconditions for undisturbed operation of the Adriatic Euroregion representing at that time a unique cooperation model between regional and local self-government bodies from Italy to Greece by means of an international association.

The project's objective at that time was to support the operation of the Adriatic Euroregion in its first operational period, improve its relations with the EU bodies and institutions and create its efficient operational programme.

The Adriatic Euroregion has grown into the Adriatic-Ionian Euroregion consisting of 26 members, regional and local authorities from Italy, Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia&Herzegovina, Montenegro, Albania and Greece.

The majority has partnered in the AdriGov project, one of which objectives is to develop and adopt the EU Strategy for the Adriatic and Ionian Region (EUSAIR) as a sort of a forerunner to the current process of establishing the Adriatic Ionian Macroregion. The adoption of this strategy should be based on the accepted Baltic Sea and Danube strategies as a precondition for, among others, more efficient utilization of European funds.

A more efficient utilization of European funds is the very objective set by the Region of Istria, which has within this project conducted activities aimed at furthering capacities for the implementation of the European regional policy and using European means in public, civil and economic sectors.

As part of this project, the Region of Istria has conducted a series of education titled 'EU Funds and Successful EU Project Management – European Tools for Local and Regional Development' within which the following workshops were carried out: 'Project Cycle Management', 'Cohesion and Structural Funds', 'Union Programmes' and 'EU Funds in Practice'. Apart from the above mentioned, a number of other workshops were also carried out: 'Regional Level Strategic Planning', 'Guidelines for the 2014-2020 Programme Period', 'Increased Economic Activity and Competitiveness of Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises', 'Introduction of Erasmus+' and 'Human Rights' seminar.

Apart from preparing and implementing European projects, it is important to support our friendly entities from the neighbouring countries which desire is to become members of the EU as well as to transfer our experience to those who wish to learn from the Region of Istria as it did by adopting experience and knowledge from its foreign friends, primarily neighbouring Italy.

The Region of Istria participates in management bodies of the IPA Cross-Border Cooperation Programme. The majority of projects has been funded through





Slovenia-Croatia and Adriatic cross-border programmes resulting in the acquisition of rich experience and setting up foundations for efficient structural fund management.

MULTILATERAL COOPERATION

The Region of Istria participates in the work of numerous international organizations, primarily those which gather the regional level of authority. It is a member of or its representatives cooperate with international organizations, initiatives and networks, the most important of which are the following: AER - Assembly of European Regions (the Region of Istria has been a member since 1994; this association gathers more than 250 regions from 25 counties for the purpose of its representation before European institutions), CRPM - Conference of European Peripheral Maritime Regions (since 2001), IRE - Institute of the Regions of Europe (with its head office in Salzburg and the Region of Istria as one of its founders in 2005), AE the Adriatic Euroregion (founded in Pula in 2006 with its head office in Pula), AEBR - Association of European Border Regions, Wateregio (2008), ALDA - Association of Local Democracy Agencies, MMFN - Mediterranean Model Forest Network (2008), AREV - Assembly of European Wine-Producing Regions (2008), CEMR - Council of European Municipalities and Regions (2010), R20 - Regions of Climate Action (2010), NECSTouR - Network of European Regions for Competitive and Sustainable Tourism (2011). The Region of Istria also cooperates with the European Council - the Congress of Regional and Local Authorities and the EU Committee of the Regions.

The political cooperation with the above mentioned organizations aims at fostering economic, cultural and other forms of cooperation. The cooperation with international organizations results in experience and new knowledge in various regional development areas. The objective of being a part and participating in the work of such topic-focused partner networks is to improve a sector, meet good practices, establish partnership relations with other regions and eventually create and deliver joint development projects.

BILATERAL COOPERATION

Under bilateral cooperation with foreign regions, the following international cooperation agreements in various areas have been concluded: Tuscany (Italy, 1994), Liguria (Italy, 2010), Veneto (Italy, 1995/renewed in 2013), Friuli-Venezia Giulia (Italy, 1999/renewed in 2011), Somogy (Hungary, 1998), Carinthia (Austria, 1998), Hargita (Romania, 2000), Vojvodina (Serbia, 2001), Zenica-Doboj Canton (BIH, 2004), Kerry (Ireland, 2004), Yunnan (China, 2004), Trenčin (Slovakia, 2004), Zheijang (China, 2005), Sarajevo Canton (BIH, 2008), Champagne-Ardenne (France, 2009), Puglia (Italy, 2009), Emilia-Romagna (Italy, 2011), Malopolska (Poland, 2013).

Apart from these regions and despite not having signed cooperation agreements, the Region of Istria also successfully cooperates with numerous other regions on European projects or within the work of international organizations or other joint initiatives.

The main project objective is to promote the culture which supports **human rights, peace and global development among young Europeans** in Italy, Croatia and France for the purpose of building a fairer future without poverty and conflicts. On the other hand, a more specific goal entails raising awareness and understanding among EU pupils, aged 11 to 18, in Tuscany, Lower Normandy and the Region of Istria of the ways in which they can use their opinions, attitudes and activities in promoting human rights both globally and locally.

Within the Istrian Region focused project, numerous activities have been foreseen starting from training primary and secondary school teachers. They will be acquainted with methodology and information regarding the specific human right, followed by its implementation during educational pupils' awareness raising activities in the classrooms. The central project event, the Human Rights Meeting, will be held every year on the occasion of the Human Rights Day. This event will provide pupils with an opportunity to be active, present their works and ask guests questions. Invited guests will include relevant writers, scientists, artists, musicians and actors as well as pupils from the partnership regions of Tuscany and Lower Normandy. This will be followed by democratic participation workshops aimed at developing several proposals to be presented directly by the pupils to local decision makers during the final workshop. Relevant decision makers will promise to carry out one of the presented proposals. The national workshop, which will be attended by numerous relevant stakeholders for the purpose of analysing human rights and their place in school curricula, will also be held as part of the project.

As part of the project, an interactive online platform will be set up aimed at developing experiences and promoting activities among pupils and teachers from

The Do the Right(s) Thing! Project is the result and an example of implementing a good practice of multi-year human rights-related education among secondary school pupils in the Tuscany region. The implementation of the project started in the Region of Istria in the very moment of introducing the subject of citizenship education in the Croatian secondary school curricula aimed at preparing pupils to leave school as active and responsible citizens. Specific human rights which will be taught to pupils during workshops as part of the Do the Right(s) Thing! will greatly contribute to achieving this goal.

three regions. The Human Rights File focusing on the human right discussed, will be published every year in four languages.

The human right topic will change every year of the project implementation as agreed by the project partners. The first year topic is 'The Right to Peace for Sustainable Planet'.

The objective is to include a total of 43,350 pupils, 398 teachers and 60 local decision makers in three regions during the three years of project implementation.

The project partners are: Region of Istria (Croatia), Region of Tuscany, Oxfam Italy, Florence University (Italy), Region of Lower Normandy and International Institute for Human Rights and Peace (France).

- » increasing students' awareness of human rights by connecting with their colleagues in the EU and beyond as well as their understanding on how their local activities can contribute to human rights protection, promotion and advancement both locally and globally
- » establishing a sense of security in primary and secondary school teachers who in their classes teach about human rights issues
- » increasing local authority capacities in three regions for designing and promoting joint activities to support and improve human rights; local authorities tackle challenges such as global poverty in an active manner by exchanging experience and expertise

The S.I.M.P.L.E. project was focused on the systematic gathering of information about the status of protection of minority rights in the Adriatic regions of five different countries (Italy, Croatia, Slovenia, Montenegro and Albania) and the analysis of their sociological, culturological, legal and political aspects that will provide the foundation for the development of a common strategy.

The most important results achieved through the project implementation consist in the identification of obstacles that hinder the comprehensive socio-economic cohesion of the members of ethnic minority groups in the Adriatic regions, the elaboration of the Adriatic Action Plan for the promoting and strengthening of minority groups, creating a public-private cooperation system – the Adriatic Permanent Observatory on Minority Communities – defining joint guidelines and governance models, developing intensive capacity building actions for professionals in the minority communities for the promotion and protection of minority rights, raising public awareness of minority rights across the entire Adriatic region population through the organization of conferences, seminars and workshops.

As part of the S.I.M.P.L.E. project, numerous programmes focused on strengthening minority communities cultural identities and diversities in the Adriatic region countries were launched including the establishment of the Multilingual Supporting Agency of the Region of Istria.

The programmes provided practical aid to citizens as well as local and regional public entities, especially in translating official records, documents and signs as well as text books. Particular help was provided in advising on citizens' rights and language issues. A short bilingual guide was drafted focused on legislation as well





The European S.I.M.P.L.E. project is the acronym for Strengthening the Identity of Minority People Leads to Equality. This is the first initiative of the institutional cooperation between countries bordering on the Adriatic Sea (participating countries include Croatia, Italy, Montenegro, Albania and Slovenia) which aim is to strengthen the position of native Italian national community by promoting bilingualism in observance of the statues of Istrian municipalities, cities and the Region and through the promotion of cultural plurality, as an expression of the value of cultural diversity.

as a leaflet listing bilingual signs, which was distributed to cities and municipalities as well as all entrepreneurs with an aim of promoting equality in the use of the Croatian and Italian languages across the Region of Istria.

Special attention was paid to professional education of translators and the acquisition of a uniform terminology. With this in mind, translators will be connected in the network and provided with a single approach in performing demanding translation jobs. Thus, a leading computer aided translation tool on the market, SDL Trados, was acquired. This resulted in reduced translation costs, quality, consistent and accurate translation as well as a simple building of the translation memory and a terminology database.

Italian language courses were organized for the employees of the Police Department of Istria and elderly care and nursing facilities in the Region of Istria. An info-kiosk was procured and placed in the Italian Community in Rovinj as well as headphones for simultaneous interpretation.

The European Commission confirmed the success of this project by selecting it to be an example of a successful project from the Republic of Croatia in the field of the topic-related social inclusion and development.

The project was carried out by the Region of Istria in cooperation with the Italian Union Rijeka (Croatia), Region of Abruzzo, Progetti Sociali s.r.l. Impresa sociale, Institute for International Sociology of Gorizia (Italy), Italian Union of Koper (Slovenia), Ministry for Human and Minority Rights of Montenegro (Montenegro), Municipality of Durres and Centre for Cooperation and Development from Tirana (Albania).

The AdriGov project aims at defining and promoting the Adriatic Governance Operational Plan across the Adriatic territory as an important step towards the adoption of the **Adriatic Ionian Macroregional Strategy** and the creation of synergy for an efficient approach to regional development possibilities. In line with the said, other objectives are connected to knowledge transfer in order to boost European integration and the EU awareness by enhancing **competencies and work of local and regional self-government professionals in European fund management, financing and administration**.

The Region of Istria, as a project partner, is responsible for a working package called the Instrument for EU Integration within which the EU and International Centre was opened in Istria focused on promoting international cooperation in





the Adriatic Ionian Macroregion as well as Central and Southeast Europe. Management boosting by regional development has been envisaged by strengthening capacity for strategic planning, preparation and implementation of projects subsidized by the EU and other international sourced funds, based on a systematic implementation of the education programme, professional improvement and scientific research.

Partners: Region of Istria, DUNEA – Regional Development Agency of the Region of Dubrovnik and Neretva (Croatia), Molise, Puglia, Marche, Veneto, Abruzzo, Emilia-Romagna regions and Informest (Italy), Municipality of Kotor (Montenegro), Region of Epirus (Greece), Region of Shkodra (Albania) and Herzegovina-Neretva Canton (BIH).

Following the Croatian EU accession, the number of possibilities in public, private and civil sectors opened up as well as the EU aided project proposal fundings. Large development projects represent a particular challenge for regional and local self-governments for which they have been readily preparing. We have therefore used this project to educate the Istrian Region stakeholders on using European funds through a newly opened EU and International Cooperation Centre by educating 400 participants during 2013 and 2014.

The project wishes to support active participation of citizens in the EU democratic life through innovative and informal education methods such as the theatre of the oppressed, public consultations, media promotion and public opinion surveys.

The project will especially focus on the young by training junior trainers on active citizenship locally as well as internationally during a training held in London. Having completed their London training, junior trainers will return to their countries and organize local public activities to raise citizens' awareness of current topics. The second part of the project also includes active citizenship training. However,



it is intended for trainers/activists who will first meet in Bulgaria and then organize local events to transfer that knowledge onto their local communities. Apart from trainings, 14 local public discussions will also be organized, two European values and active citizenship manuals written, promotional materials made, a study trip to Brussels and the European Parliament organized.

Project partners are the following: Foundation for Partnership and Civil Society Development, Region of Istria (Croatia), Foundation for Promotion Science and Creativity (Poland), Contemporary Society Foundation (Bulgaria), Kid Pina Association (Slovenia), Svetionik Association (Montenegro), Cooperativa Cosmo (Italy) and CSV/Volonteurope (Great Britain).

The largest Foundation project to-date includes partners from the countries with the lowest turnout at the European Parliament elections. It is a follow-up of the previously successfully implemented I.C.E. and THINK.EU projects and a continuation of Foundation activities focused on educating citizens on EU benefits and its opportunities, but also in line with the active citizenship campaign and the importance of including citizens in the decision making process.

Cardiovascular disease as the biggest public health issue

Cardiovascular diseases are the leading cause of death throughout the Adriatic region including Croatia, Italy and Albania. As this is a multicausal group of diseases caused by a number of risky factors, the very term cardiovascular disease covers a wide range as well as numerous separate entities. Consequences of these diseases can, in its major part, be prevented by **healthy lifestyle and nutrition**. However, most often citizens do not possess scientific information on how to achieve it nor a sufficient number of adequate expert and educational programmes across the entire region.

The LOVE YOUR HEART project was envisaged to aim at the cross-border cooperation and networking while creating a joint model of **preventing the most fatal diseases throughout the Adriatic region – cardiovascular diseases**. The established model of prevention must be adjusted to various development and economic situations in Istria, Veneto and Albania as well as enable more accessible and more economical prevention services based on scientific principles (despite the global crisis causing lower investments into health promotion). An expert and sustainable programme of the cardiovascular disease prevention has been developed through a joint work of the existing and newly built international and interregional networks as well as an integrated cooperation of administration bodies, scientific institutions and the civil sector engaged in cardiovascular disease prevention.

All project objectives and planned results contribute to improving citizens' health status and decreasing the number of illnesses and deaths caused by cardiovascular diseases as well as huge consequential costs.





Pursuant to the Health Plan for the Citizens of the Region of Istria, the prevention of cardiovascular diseases has been one of the public health priorities since 2005. During the work conducted so far, the need for a stronger mutual connection of all prevention service providers has been recognized as well as the need for raising the current work to a higher level by providing wider availability and increased cost–effectiveness of prevention programmes as well as the need for additional education of health workers.

Wishing to meet those needs, the Region of Istria nominated the LOVE YOUR HEART project for the 2007 – 2013 IPA Adriatic Cross-Border Cooperation Programme in 2011 together with Istrian Health Care Centres, Pula General Hospital, three Italian and one Albanian partner.

LOVE YOUR HEART represents first such project in the scientific field in Croatia. It has been recognized nationally and its results (educational materials, a regional prevention centre) are also unique in the Croatian public health area.

The Cardiovascular Disease Prevention Centre in Istria

The LOVE YOUR HEART project has provided infrastructure and resources for the Cardiovascular Disease Prevention Centre in the Region of Istria as a location for educating professionals and citizens as well as coordinating the work of all prevention cardiovascular service providers (health institutions, NGOs, local self-government bodies, educational institutions and sport and recreational associations).

The Centre has been set up in two parts. The first part is located within the Istrian clinics where most health promotion, IT and citizens awareness activities as well as cardiovascular diseases prevention work consolidation are taking place. The Pula Centre closely cooperates with the clinics in Istria and family medicine doctors performing check-ups aimed at early discovery of risky patients. The Centre also provides individual advisory services as well as a group work with risky citizens and patients who have already suffered a heart attack or a stroke.

The second part of the Centre is located in Pula General Hospital. It has a diagnostically consultatory character as well as an educational one (for hospital patients). It diagnostically processes the most risky patients sent for a check-up by family doctors without waiting.

The village of Završje is situated in the Istrian north and it belongs to the Municipality of Grožnjan. It is some 20 km away from the Slovenian and Italian borders and its characteristics favour the **development of rural tourism**. Završje is a specific locality. Its historical centre in the form of an acropolis is a protected urban ensemble surrounded by rich fields. Its population has been mostly displaced and the inhabitants that remain rely primarily on agriculture and the production of typical local products. Završje is a typical example of Istrian urban architecture amidst unspoiled nature.

The R.E.D.D. H.I.L.L. project (Rural and Economic Development of a Disadvantaged Historical Istrian Locality) was created with the aim of revitalising this rural area.

Former School Building – A Present Day Modern Polyvalent Centre

The former abandoned school building situated at the entrance into the village has been renovated under the project and today it houses the **modern Polyvalent Centre in Završje**. Following the extensive internal and external works, the building's total net area of 329 m² houses on its ground floor a tourist gallery with an info point, a small exhibition gallery and a multifunctional room while on its first floor there is a polyvalent conference hall and an open terrace of about 30 m² which is put to excellent use during the warmer months.

The Polyvalent Centre of Završje has become the first multifunctional centre in this area, the ground floor is used mostly for tourist and commercial purposes while the first floor with its conference hall is used for the organisation of various



events. An info point designed to provide all kinds of information about Završje and its surroundings, about the events in the Municipality and tourist attractions of the Istrian peninsula has been set up in the building. There is a gallery that promotes typical local products such as honey, cheese, lavender, wine, oil etc. During the implementation of the project, specific project target groups had the opportunity to participate in the workshops that were designed to create a 'platform' for the exchange of good practice in rural sustainable development of Adriatic rural localities. Four workshops were held, led by the representatives of the Italian project partner regions. The workshop topics were the following: 'Development and implementation of sustainable territorial strategies', 'Preservation and valorisation of cultural heritage for tourism purposes', 'Innovative territorial marketing methodologies' and 'Active citizenship and the inclusion of citizens in the elaboration of territorial strategies'.

Information package about the location – complete information for the visitors

The production of a brochure about Završje and the Grožnjan area was financed by the project as was a leaflet featuring a map of Završje and some technical information for tourists. Nineteen tourist information panels about the location, its architectural and cultural sights and local tradition have been put up. The panels have been placed on all the most prominent structures in Završje and Grožnjan. Road signs directing the visitors towards Završje have been placed in all strategic positions.

The project of revitalisation of Završje is the model according to which we desire to carry out EU projects in the Region of Istria because it was implemented in continuity through the use of several different international sources of financing. It is our objective to lay the foundations and prepare the project on the basis of which Završje would be fully renovated from the Structural Funds. This is a project that incorporates the revitalisation of cultural heritage, tourism, rural development and environmental protection.

As the route of the former narrow gauge Parenzana railway was crossing the territory of Croatia, Slovenia and Italy, its mutually development is of utmost importance. The PARENZANA MAGIC project is closely connected to PARENZANA I and PARENZANA II projects, it is their continuation and a new Path of Health and Friendship revitalisation phase. Apart from the **route's infrastructural renewal** resulting from the implementation of the first two projects, **it started to be used for cultural, sport and tourist purposes and contributed to improving and enriching tourist services along its area**. The new tourist offer including trips and cultural and sport experiences as well as building new route infrastructure and facilities is expected to achieve recognizability of the route as well as the destination as a whole. As the project promotes healthy living focused on sport and recreation in nature, most project activities are connected with the development of sport and recreational events along and on the route itself available for tourists as well as local population.

Sustainable development preconditions represent the basis for project implementation. They are primarily expected in the form of establishing the Parenzana Public Institution responsible for route maintenance even following the project





completion. This will additionally enrich the route offer and meet specific user needs. The purpose of developing additional packages, which will increase the route value, is to stimulate the private sector into furthering its activities and investments and linking them to Parenzana. The project foresees activities, which will further existing professional knowledge and experience for the purpose of achieving a certain level of historical knowledge of the Parenzana route as well as awareness of the importance of sport and health. Professional workshops will be organized for educating target groups thus developing and enhancing acquired knowledge. Increased awareness of the route's development possibilities and its importance for rural development and awareness raising regarding cultural, historical and spatial values of the route for the purpose of preserving such a unique historic and cultural heritage will strengthen the cooperation between Croatian and Slovenian municipalities, influence the prolongation of the tourist season by increasing integrated cross-border cooperation and stimulate economic growth of border areas with tourism as their main activity.

Aware of the beauty of a fairy-like route woven into the mild Istrian landscape, many passionate walkers, bikers and nature lovers have stressed its huge potential within the appropriate revitalisation. PARENZANA MAGIC is the third consecutive natural follow-up of the previous PARENZANA I and PARENZANA II projects titled 'The Path of Health and Friendship' and 'Reviving the Path of Health and Friendship'.

Allocated funds will be used for improving route conditions and introducing some new offer elements, apart from bike riding and walking. This is the third step of project implementation which aims at developing in a manner suitable for becoming eligible for more significant amounts from the EU structural funds which would be used for renovating the entire length of the route.

The project delivery progressed through 5 work packages: Project management and coordination, **Development of a revitalisation model of the Istrian hinterland**, Local activities of the Istrian hinterland revitalisation and their integration in the tourist offer, Integrated development of tourist infrastructure and human resources as well as communication and informing of the public.

As part of the Revitas project, the methodology for the revitalisation of rural areas during joint cross-border workshops and study tours was developed as well as joint cross-border studies of the Istrian hinterland revitalisation model.

The conservation of the original dry stone building method was the topic of the seven-day workshops in Vodnjan and Topolovac accompanied by practical tutorials and a visual presentation of a dry stone reconstruction.

Theme trails, belvederes and rest areas were included into an integrated tourist offer (on the territory of Slovenian Istria, it included the organization of three types of trails and 10 rest areas, while in Croatian Istria it was the clearing of 20 kilometres of bike and hiking trails in the ethno-archaeological park of the Vodnjan area, their signposting and arranging of 5 rest areas).

Revitalisation of the historic cores resulted in the reconstruction of the square in Topolovac and the square tower of the Morosini-Grimani Castle in Svetvinčenat.

During two months there were sixteen day long cross-border workshops organized for the heads of info centres in four modules: Sustainable Forms of Tourism, Cultural Tourism and Identity, Marketing and Destination Development and Intangible Heritage.

As part of the project, 2 three-day seminars for tourist guides, tourist agency workers, entrepreneurs, local administration and the general public were organized, for the total of 120 participants.

Six info-centres in Croatian and Slovenian Istria were set up: Koper – Sv. Anton, Piran, Izola, Poreč (Istrian Parliament Building), Buzet (old town core), Svetvin-čenat (Morosini-Grimani Castle) and 20 info-points with info-kiosks.

With an aim of promoting Istria as a unique tourist destination through tasting typical products, promotional and education workshops as well as other events and activities in info-centres and historic cores, a total of 23 events, were organized.


Planned project activities also included the work on integrated cross-border tourist promotional products: a photo monograph on Istrian frescoes with a complementary DVD, 2 multi-lingual (6 languages) guides on old town cores and cultural and natural sights in the Istrian hinterland, a project DVD, leaflets, postcards, posters, bookmarks, reprint of the Heart of Istria project brochure were published. The project web site was set up, 12 joint press conferences organized and two promotional videos filmed.

All the mentioned activities contributed to the identification of Istria as a **recognizable joint cross-border tourist destination**, to the organization of cross-border

The activities of the Region of Istria as a project partner include development of technical documentation for the **construction of the boat equipped for**



The importance of this project for the Region of Istria is the comprehensiveness of the pilot activity and its focus on concrete effects resulting in improved life quality of the Istrian region inhabitants. The purchase of infrared cameras ensures upgraded early detection and fire monitoring systems, which leads to improved life and property protection. The use of wood chips from our forests as a heating fuel in the public education institution additionally cleans the forests and prevents fire danger thus creating conditions for faster fire suppression. Developing documentation for the construction of the fire extinguishing boat sets preconditions for decreasing the sea pollution risk.

The Holistic project contributes to a systematic progress in developing coordinated policies, strategies and activities of all the stakeholders involved in the environmental and asset preservation sector.


The ŽIVO! project continues to meet the KUP project objectives (www.project-kup.org) with an expanded partnership structure and increased focus on establishing adequate supervision of water spring abundance and quality along the borders between Croatia and Slovenia.

The basis for further sustainability of conducting such activities along the borders is dedicated equipping of the Scientific and Education Speleo-House Centre in Vodice, established following the reconstruction of the old school within the KUP project.

The Scientific and Education Speleo-House Centre will be equipped with special laboratory equipment as well as with the congress area and dormitories for 25 guests. Scientific expeditions, faculty groups and primary and secondary school pupils attending education in nature will have the use of the area.

The Museum of Karst Specificities has been envisaged on its ground floor with a professional curator along with the possibility to visit **mountaineering sport** and education paths, which will be developed in the vicinity.

The possibility of online booking will also be developed as an opportunity for using the facility touristically for a smaller group of organized visitors (e.g. team building and alike).



The facility is located in the centre of the Istrian karst, only six kilometres from the Slovenian border, on the sparsely populated and poorly developed area surrounded by undisturbed nature.

The project foresees a partnership cooperation with scientific institutions and facilities which will conduct a number of field researches of the karst area, thus contributing to the acquisition of new knowledge and information of the Istrian karst.

Partners: Region of Istria, Natura Histrica Public Institution, Faculty of Civil Engineering, University of Rijeka (Croatia), Karst Research Institute – ZRC SAZU, National Health, Environment and Nutrition Laboratory – NLZOH (Slovenia).

Northern Istria, located at the border between Croatia and Slovenia, is characterized bu karst of developed surface and subterranean hudrography as well as very valuable water resources – water springs of essential importance for water supply of the Region of Istria and the Slovenian Coast. This water supply system includes Sv. Ivan and Bulaž springs from the Croatian side, Rižana spring from the Slovenian side and several smaller springs (e.g. Mlini in Croatia). These karst springs have a very complex aquifer recharge system by direct precipitation infiltration as well as by surface water flows ending in abusses with a direct and fast hydrology connection with karst aguifers. All these springs are characterized by borderline watersheds and aquifers.



NATURA 2000 is an ecological network of protected areas in which over 1000 endangered and endemic species and approximately 230 habitat types defined in EU directives are protected (Habitat Directive and Bird Directive). The mapping of marine habitats in the Region of Istria was carried out in nine cities and municipalities – Pula, Labin, Vodnjan, Kršan, Barban, Raša, Medulin, Marčana and Fažana up to a depth of 40 meters. On the basis of the collected data, propos-

The Region of Istria started a systematic mapping of the Istrian marine underwater habitats with the purpose of selecting potential marine habitats to be included in the NATURA 2000 network. The mapping of the areas belonging to the municipalities of Ližnjan, Bale, a part of the City of Rovinj and the Lim Channel has been financed by our own funds. After the SHAPE project completion. 75 % of the marine territoru of the Region of Istria will be charted. Last sustematic mapping was carried out in the 1970s. Data collected during the marine mapping will also be used for defining the purpose of the marine territory during the modification of the Physical Plan of the Region of Istria as well as in the development of the Strategic Environmental Impact Study. The County Waste Management Centre Kaštijun (ŽCGO) was designed considering all the requirements set by valid European and Croatian regulations. It consists of a modern facility for mechanical and biological processing and waste disposal surfaces (bioreactor landfills). The analysis of environmental, economic, technological parameters and hydrogeological surveys resulted in the selection of the Kaštijun site near Pula for the construction of ŽCGO. For the purpose of establishing an integral waste management system in the Region, six transfer stations will be built apart from the main Centre. They will be located in six Istrian towns: Umag, Poreč, Rovinj, Labin, Pazin and Buzet.



The completed construction of the County Waste Management Centre Kaštijun will represent the end of the project cycle of one of the more significant infrastructural projects in the Region of Istria. By establishing a new, modern waste management and processing system in line with the highest European standards as well as its energy use, we will become one of the leading waste management regions in Croatia.

The Poreč project is the largest public sector project in this region co-financed by the European funds.

Its delivery was initiated for upgrading the obsolete sewage system and due to an increasing need for environmental preservation and protection of natural resources. There are currently five separate sewage systems on the Poreč area, which carry our only mechanical treatment with chemical wastewater processing before water is discharged through subsea outfalls into the Adriatic Sea. **Untreated wastewaters from the large area are discharged into the Adriatic, which adversely affects tourism.**

A part of the old sewage system is decaying and needs to be replaced. As settlements located hinterland are not connected onto the public wastewater sewage system, the connection needs to be built.

As part of the project, some 23 kilometres of the existing sewage network and 26 pumping stations will be reconstructed as well as collectors built leading









to new wastewater treatment plants. The existing land portions of the subsea outfalls will be renewed and upgraded. The existing as well as seven new pumping stations will be equipped with automatic and telemetry equipment with the possibility of connecting onto the single supervisory-control system.

Apart from the above, the sewage network will expand to include additional settlements in the total of 62 kilometres as well as 26 pumping stations. The automatic and telemetry equipment will equip new pumping stations with the possibility of their connection into the single supervisory-control system.

The construction of four membrane bioreactor MBR type wastewater treatment devices has been foreseen: Lanterna with capacity of 30,000 PE, Poreč – north with capacity of 3,000 PE, Poreč – south with capacity of 48,000 PE, Vrsar with capacity of 22,500 PE; membrane bioreactor MBR type with individual and central supervisory-control systems and access roads as well as the design and construction of the solar drying and sludge composting plant.

On the day of Croatia's accession to the EU, the European Commission approved the Poreč Project – the sewage sustem with wastewater treatment plants to be financed from the EU structural funds. This project would not have been carried out without the umbrella organization, Hrvatske vode (Croatian Waters), which aided and co-financed its delivery. Having become the part of the EU. Usluaa Poreč d.o.o. took over the investor role. As of Februaru 1, 2014 this role has been transferred onto a newlu established companu Odvodnia Poreč d.o.o. Every successful project which managed to obtain European funding, as did this one by the town of Poreč, must serve as an excellent example of how it is possible to get significant funds with a good business project. serious development of complete documentation and strict adherence to European criteria enabling city's progress and further development.

Why LEGEND?

LEGEND is the biggest campaign of geothermal energy investment ever launched in the Adriatic regions focused on promoting the use of the GCHP technology and its impact on the environment and energy efficiency. The exchange of knowledge with the Balkan countries, replacement of energy fuel in public buildings designated for the pilot-plant installation and strong marketing strategy should diversely raise awareness of the geothermal energy potential and focus technological progress and development of the green market by encouraging public and private investments.

Geothermal heat pump pilot investment in Labin

The geothermal heat pump pilot investment represents a key promotional tool of the LEGEND project. IRENA carried out this investment within a new nursery building of the Pjerina Verbanac kindergarten in Labin. This is the only newly built investment carried out as part of the LEGEND project. In light of this fact, IRENA was completely free in designing its optimal system for utilizing advantages of geothermal heat pumps in the best way possible.

The installation process commenced in July 2013 by drilling exploratory holes and ended by commissioning the system in March 2014. It consists of the floor heating system, wall heating/cooling, ceiling heating/cooling (fan convectors) and the ventilation system with installed heat recovery ventilator. Low temperature surface heating elements were chosen to ensure maximum system basis efficiency, 22 kW geothermal heat pumps which takes heat energy required for 350 m² surfaced building heating/cooling from three 100 m deep holes drilled in exceptionally compact lime. Thermal capacity of each hole is 5.4 kW. Following a month long testing including the 24 hour maximum load system operation and drill temperature not falling below -2°C, all expectations were met, thus rightly considering this project an example of a quality and efficient use of renewable energy sources.

The primary objective of the LEGEND project is to explain the idea of the all-present geothermal energy to local population, businessmen and local and regional administration. Current experiences regarding the geothermal energy use in the Region of Istria are connected to isolated and publicly mostly unknown cases (apart from the Health Resort Istarske Toplice). For example, Punta Verudela Resort has been using sea-stored energy for 25 years. For this very reason the geothermal potential analysis of the Region of Istria has been launched.

Education cycle on the geothermal energy exploitation potential

In April 2014, IRENA and the Faculty of Mining, Geology and Petroleum Engineering launched a comprehensive education cycle for Mate Blažina Secondary Technical School pupils from Labin. Following an introductory lecture and presenting basic principles of geothermal energy use and geothermal heat pump operation, pupils started building a geothermal heat exchanger – energy baskets laid in different soil types of the Region of Istria.

Having been laid, pupils aided by professors and students of the Faculty of Mining, Geology and Petroleum Engineering measured heat characteristics (thermal response testing) of each used material and supervised by an expert fitter, connected energy baskets into a functional exchanger field. Lectures and practical work were envisaged as a simple demo model of the heat transmission principle as well as training in basic installation skills – pressure tests, pipe connection etc.

This project aims to resolve the issues of unbalanced infrastructural development and insufficient maritime line development as well as a low service quality level for both passengers and tourists. 

The SEED project was conducted by the Administrative Department for International Cooperation and European Affairs via its representative office in Brussels.

The project main objective is to boost the use of e-services by all regional stake-holders, development and promotion of an efficient and innovative tool to simplify interaction between administration and citizens. The focus was placed on the possibility of active citizen participation in the process of European integration and project funding by local, regional and European funds. SEED was also intended for enhancing public administration transparency and proactive communication with citizens. The SEED system gathers information from online sites, public bodies and media e-service and displays it on screens and information points located strategically throughout Istria as well as worldwide as the system is also used for displaying and sending information from the Brussels representative office.

The SEED project applications help citizens by providing them with a number of necessary information available to them in the places of their everyday activities (waiting rooms, libraries, market...).

Seven interactive screens were set up across the Region of Istria i.e. in Pula, Pazin and Rovinj. In Pula, the screens were set up in the City Library, the Reading Room of the Pensioners' Club, the Jurai Dobrila University, the market building and the General Hospital. In Pazin, the screen was set up in the Health Care Centre and in Rovinj on the premises of the Italian Community. SEED also serves as a dissemination support to all international and European projects conducted in the Region of Istria. Thanks to the project, the web site of the Administrative Department of International Cooperation and European Affairs www.istra-europa.eu has been upgraded as well as the regional project base. Moreover, SEED has enabled a partial cost coverage as well as staffing of the Brussels Office. Citizens can use SEED by touch sensitive screen interactions, by interactive devices as well as by mobile i.e. smart phones as currently the most used means of communication. Every computer with online access can become a part of the SEED project information system. Furthermore, it can be used as a sort of a screensaver, which after a certain period of a computers' sleep mode starts displaying selected news and notifications.
